

A Pair of Toothed Whales in Our Sounds

Harbor porpoises (look for the round snouts) are small, stout and short-lived toothed

whales. They hunt for small, fatty fish along the floor of our sounds and inlets.

They hunt alone or in small groups. Little is known about them.

Bottle-nosed dolphins (look for

the long snouts) are sleek and long-lived toothed whales.

These sociable and acrobatic animals hunt for fish, squid and shrimp, and follow boats throughout our coastal waters. They are very well-known.
